

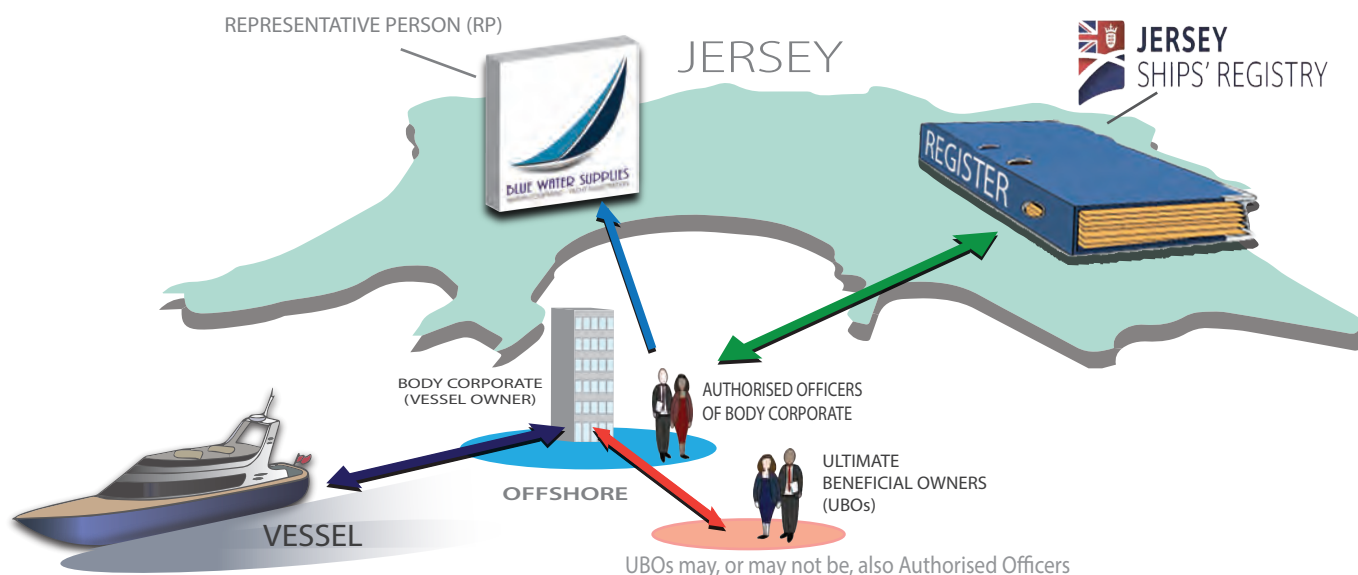
Authorised Owners of a Body Corporate

Definition of an Authorised Officers of a Body Corporate for the purposes of form and information submission to Blue Water Supplies

An Authorised Officer of a Body Corporate is an "Officer" of that company who is "Duly Authorised" to act for the company on behalf of that vessel. An "Officer" of a Body Corporate is a Director, Company Secretary or equivalent. "Duly Authorised" means that they have been expressly granted the right by the Body Corporate's principal officers (Directors) to act for the vessel.

An Authorised Officer:

- Should be a Director, Company Secretary or equivalent of the body corporate.
- Should have the right to legally bind the company to Jersey's Shipping Laws and contracts.
- Must be "Duly Authorised" to act for the vessel, including selling the vessel.
- Will be legally responsible for the actions of the vessel.
- Must be aware of the companies responsibilities with respect to Jersey shipping and other laws.
- Cannot ordinarily be a Registration Agent or other non-employee of the Body Corporate.



In the context of Ships Registration, the intent of requiring a signature from a "duly authorized officer" is to ensure the Company is aware of and has formally signed off on its responsibilities with respect to Jersey's Shipping Regulations, and to confirm that the information given is accurate. A "duly authorized officer" must have authority to legally bind the company for purposes of Ships Registration. The signatory must be formally authorized by the Company to sign such documents on the Company's behalf and should be competent and knowledgeable regarding the vessel's obligations with respect to shipping laws. Examples of signatories that are not "duly authorized officers" include non-employees, attestants or notaries, and any other individual (whether employed by the Company or not) who is not authorized to make binding commitments on the Company's behalf.

All Body Corporates who directly own a vessel should submit an "Appointment of Authorised Officers" form in compliance with the laws of the jurisdiction of incorporation.

Authorised Officers may use a Registration Agent as an intermediary between themselves and the Ships' registry and/or the Representative Person, although all contracts and application forms prepared on the Body Corporate's behalf must be signed by an Authorised Officer of the Body Corporate and not the Registration Agent.
